

## Introduction:

Chinese Book Three is the continuation of the previous textbook with higher level of Chinese language learning in terms of new lessons and new characters. Besides learning new lessons, students will also review and enhance what they have learned in the past such as Pingying, components of Chinese character and punctuation. Chinese Book Three will focus on the student's capability of speaking and listening as well learning Chinese characters. This capacity will be expanded to cover Chinese composition. It is required the students need to read and recite the lessons fluently. There are 159 new characters in this textbook which are building blocks for learning Chinese. We will use Chinese in the process of teaching Chinese lessons with some explanations in English to help the students understand the contents of the lessons. We will add Pingying (pronunciation) in Chinese Book Three. The textbook uses graphics, syllables and word comparisons to enhance the student's character recognition. Due to the current level of the students who have already mastered a substantial level of Chinese language, the teacher will use as much Chinese as possible throughout the teaching so as to create a positive Chinese learning environment and use English only when it is necessary when explaining some crucial information.
